March 3, 2012

Session One 10:15-11:30am

1. Engaging Small Group Times

2. Active Learning for Infants & Toddlers on the Go

3. Rocking Out and Keeping Fit!

This workshop will examine many reasons WHY children need to play outside and will also address some of the social factors which inhibit outdoor play.

13. Planning for Transition Times

Learn key strategies for transition times and ways to keep children actively involved when waiting can't be avoided. How can adults support and plan for transition times using music & movement, language & literacy, singing, games, props and children's interests.
